




# ATHENS ACADEMY HONOR CODE JUDICIARY PROCESS



## CONSEQUENCES

### FIRST OFFENSE

- Parent conversation.
- Honor Code violation is recorded in student's file and reported to the faculty and student body (no names given).
- Grade penalty: 70% or less.
- Student will lose National Honor Society membership, if applicable.
- Student may lose privileges including participation in school and athletic events; serving in a leadership role such as 17, Honor Council, or Student Council; and/or student privileges.
- Student may be assigned Community Restoration.
- Student will be required to participate in an oral presentation and discussion with a faculty panel.
- Student may be suspended.\*

### SECOND OFFENSE

- Parent conversation.
- Honor Code violation is recorded in student's file and reported to the faculty and student body (no names given). College Counseling Office is also notified.
- Grade will be reduced to 0.
- Student will lose privilege of participating in school and athletic events for a specified period of time; student will lose privilege of serving in a leadership role such as 17, Honor Council, or Student Council; student will lose student privileges.
- Student will be suspended and may also be given Community Restoration.
- Student will be required to participate in an oral presentation and discussion with a faculty panel.

### THIRD OFFENSE

- A third Honor Code violation is convincing evidence of the student's poor fit with Athens Academy and expulsion is almost inevitably the consequence.

*\*If the Honor Code violation involves stealing physical property, suspension will be required regardless of the level of offense, and expulsion may be warranted.*
